Research Plan

The research plan will be evaluated on the following basis:

Elements	Score
Working Topic	/10
From this topic, the audience should understand who and what you are focusing on, the area of the world you are researching, and where you stand on the issue.	
The topic should be appropriate for university level research and its description should show that you have read and thought about the topic.	
Brief Introduction	/10
Why do you believe this topic is important for the audience? What do you already know about it? Explain your personal experience, interest, or background on the topic.	
Research Question and Methods	/10
Formulate a preliminary guiding research question or thesis based on what you hope to find out, or what you hope to answer by completing this research.	
How do you plan to address your research question or thesis? Make sure to specify your particular plan/approach (i.e. specific secondary research, specific popular and scholarly sources, specific databases, websites, journals, etc.)	
Sources	/10
List two high quality sources you have already identified. Make sure they are relevant to your topic.	
Explain how you will use them, and what they include that is important for your research.	
Planning	/10
How do you plan to make time for writing? In other words, how will you organize your time in order to complete the various stages of this research paper?	
Set goals and dates, and mention how you will achieve your plan considering other courses and deadlines that you also have.
